The Game of Life and How to Play It Florence Scovel Shinn | Summary |

A Battle or A Game

Overview

"The Game of Life and How to Play It," published in 1925 by Florence Scovel Shinn, presents life not as a battle but as a "game" governed by spiritual laws. The core message is that an individual's thoughts, words, and beliefs directly shape their reality. Success, health, wealth, and perfect self-expression are attainable through understanding and applying these spiritual laws, primarily by training the imagination, mastering the power of the spoken word, practicing non-resistance, cultivating love, and following intuition.

1. Life as a Game of Giving and Receiving (Karma)

Life is presented as a game where "Whatsoever a man soweth that shall he also reap." The superconscious mind, or "God Mind within each man," holds the "perfect pattern" or Divine Design for each individual.

- Quote: "By thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned."
- Quote: "We know now, that words and thoughts are a tremendous vibratory force, ever moulding man's body and affairs."

4. The Law of Non-resistance

Resistance is equated with "Hell," as it places man in a "state of torment." The principle of non-resistance suggests that by ceasing to resist an adverse situation and instead blessing it, the situation loses its power and dissolves. Fear attracts negative experiences, while fearlessness removes them.

5. Love as the Fulfilling of the Law

Love is presented as the strongest magnetic force in the universe and "God in manifestation." All sickness and unhappiness are attributed to the "violation of the law of love." Selfless, unconditional love, free from fear and criticism, is the key to attracting perfect relationships, health, and goodwill. Unforgiveness and resentment are major causes of disease and negative external conditions.

6. Intuition and Divine Guidance

This path is one of joy, not labour, and divine supply will always be at hand for its manifestation.

8. Faith Over Fear

Fear is identified as man's "only enemy" and "inverted faith." It creates distorted mental pictures that manifest as feared outcomes. To play the game successfully, one must "substitute faith for fear" and obliterate all mental pictures of evil by impressing the subconscious with good. Active faith, demonstrated through actions, is crucial for manifestation.

9. Forgiveness and Grace

Christianity is founded upon the law of forgiveness, which is a "higher law" than Karma. Through Christ (the Christ within each man), one can be redeemed from Karmic law and the law of cause and effect, entering a state of "grace." This allows for the neutralization of mistakes and freedom from unhappy conditions.

- Quote: "Christianity is founded upon the law of forgiveness ~ Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the Karmic law..."

10. Casting the Burden (Impressing the Subconscious)

The easiest way to impress the subconscious with good is by "casting the burden" upon the superconscious mind (the Christ within). A burden is an adverse thought or condition rooted in the subconscious. By repeatedly affirming, "I cast this burden on the Christ within, and I go free," one allows the superconscious to dissolve the negative belief, clearing the vision and leading to manifestation of good.

- Quote: "The only thing which gives anything weight in nature is the law of gravitation... and that is what Jesus Christ meant when he said: 'My yoke is easy and my burden is light."
- Quote: "How scientific it then is, to cast the burden upon the superconscious mind (or Christ within) where it is 'made light,' or dissolved into its 'native nothingness."

Practical Applications and Affirmations

- **Prosperity:** Believe God is your unfailing supply. "I have a wonderful work, in a wonderful way, I give wonderful service, for wonderful pay!" Pay bills cheerfully and give with love, knowing money in circulation opens channels for more. Hoarding leads to loss.
- **Health:** All disease has a mental correspondence. To heal the body, "heal the soul" (subconscious mind) by restoring it with right ideas and love. Deny the appearance of disease and affirm perfect health as a divine idea.
- Relationships: Practice selfless love, free from jealousy, criticism, and resentment. "Salute the Divinity in you" and others. Bless enemies, and they lose power to harm
- Decision Making: Overcome indecision by affirming, "I am always under direct inspiration; I make right decisions, quickly." Rely on intuition, not psychic readings or horoscopes, which deal with the "Karmic path."
- Overcoming Obstacles: Never turn back from a demand made in faith. "Having done all ~ Stand." Demonstrations often come at the eleventh hour when one stops reasoning and lets "Infinite Intelligence" work.
- Daily Practice: Start each day with positive affirmations like, "Thy will be done this day! To-day is a day of completion; I give thanks for this perfect day, miracle shall follow miracle and wonders shall never cease." Live fully in the "now," blessing the past and future.
- Receiving: Be a "cheerful receiver" as well as a giver. Refusing gifts out of pride blocks channels.
- Denials and Affirmations: Use specific statements to release desired outcomes (e.g., "Infinite Spirit, open the way for my right home, my right friend, my right position. I give thanks it now manifests under grace in a perfect way.") Always include "under grace, in a perfect way" to ensure harmonious manifestation. Deny appearances of disease or lack, then affirm the perfect divine idea.

Glossary of Key Terms

Active Faith: Demonstrating belief through actions, even when there are no visible signs of the desired outcome. It is the "bridge" to manifestation.

Affirmations: Positive statements made to impress the subconscious mind with truth and desirable outcomes, often repeated aloud with conviction.

Carnal Mind (Mortal Mind): The human, reasoning mind that perceives life based on appearances, including limitations, sickness, and poverty.

Law of Forgiveness (Law of Grace): A higher spiritual law that transcends the law of Karma, freeing man from the consequences of past mistakes through spiritual understanding and the Christ within.

Law of Non-resistance: The principle that resisting evil or adverse situations gives them power. By refusing to resist and instead blessing the situation or seeing its good, it dissipates.
